SCHOOL DISTRICT STATISTICS

The Leigh Community School District (#39) comprises 80.7 square miles. The district covers parts of Colfax, Platte, and Stanton counties. The community's financial base develops from an agriculture economy. A new HS (7-12 grades) was built onto the existing Elementary building creating a PK-12 facility in 2020. In 2024, due to increasing enrollment, 4 classrooms were added to the elementary wing. The mission of Leigh Community Schools is to foster a positive educational culture where: STUDENTS thrive, TEACHERS guide, ADMINISTRATORS lead, PARENTS support and the COMMUNITY is the foundation for all.

The Leigh Community Schools district has a total valuation of \$624,296,495. The current total tax levy is 78 cents.



Leigh FCCLA Members Shine at District STAR Events Competition

The Leigh FCCLA chapter recently participated in the District STAR Events Competition. STAR—Students Taking Action with Recognition—provides members with the opportunity to showcase their knowledge and skills through a variety of projects connected to Family and Consumer Sciences. Below, you'll find the competition results along with highlights of the impressive projects completed by our students!

Elizabeth Hoffman - Job Interview, Level 3

1st Place, Gold Medal, State Qualifier

This event requires participants to prepare a portfolio, including a job application, and participate in an interview. Liz prepared her portfolio for a career in marketing and received a perfect score on her interview!

Ava Kasik, Karly Wendt, Nevaeh Zulkoski - Focus on Children, Level 3

1st Place, Gold Medal, State Qualifier

For their Focus on Children project, Ava, Karly, and Nevaeh wanted to educate elementary-aged students about the importance of whole foods and nutrition. Through funding provided by the Team Nutrition Grant, they implemented a comprehensive nutrition education project designed to teach elementary students about whole foods and healthy eating habits. Grant funds were used to purchase all necessary supplies to support hands-on learning experiences, including food preparation and monthly taste-testing activities. Using NDE's Harvest of the Month resources, they will teach students about a variety of fruits and vegetables.

Sydney Messerlie - Teaching Strategies, Level 3

1st Place, Gold Medal, State Qualifier

Teaching Strategies is an individual event that recognizes participants who exhibit knowledge and competency in incorporating research-based teaching strategies into an original lesson plan activity. Sydney chose to focus her lesson plan on preschool-aged children. Her "learning to count pizza party" lesson featured strategies such as modeling, prompting, and game-based learning activities. Not only was she evaluated on the creation of a lesson plan, but she was also required to role-play her lesson with the evaluators acting as the students.

Luke Eisenmann, Kyle McMullin - Repurpose and Redesign, Level 3

3rd Place, Gold Medal, State Qualifier

This project focused on repurposing an old, unusable piano into a functional and visually appealing wine bar. By disassembling, redesigning, and reconstructing the piano, Luke and Kyle transformed a discarded item into a sustainable piece of furniture with practical storage. The project required planning, creativity, and hands-on carpentry skills while emphasizing environmental responsibility.

Jocelyn Donnelly, Halle Korth - Chapter in Review Display, Level 3

3rd Place, Silver Medal, State Qualifier

Throughout their project, Jocelyn and Halle highlighted our chapter's program of work and shared

how our chapter's happenings reflect the purposes of FCCLA and promote Family and Consumer Sciences. They focused on our membership campaigns, our chapter meetings and recognition activities, and our participation in leadership and competitive events.

Ella Higby, Madi Freudenburg - National Programs in Action, Level 3

2nd Place, Gold Medal, State Qualifier

Ella and Madi focused on the National Program, Families First. Their goals were to provide cookie kits to the families who received donations from Leigh Cares. Their hope was that families could use the opportunity to spend time together and build strong family connections over the holiday season. Each cookie kit included 12 cookies, 2 frosting bags, sprinkles, and a handmade card from Ella and Madi on behalf of our FCCLA chapter.

Emersyn Urban, Vylet Hollatz - Chapter Service Project Display, Level 3

1st Place, Silver Medal, State Qualifier

The purpose of the Chapter Service Project STAR Event is to recognize chapters that develop and implement an in-depth service project that makes a worthwhile contribution to families, schools, and communities. Emersyn and Vylet conducted a winter clothing drive with drop boxes at Citizens State Bank, the school office, the FCCLA Family Christmas event, and at the Humphrey/Lindsay versus Clarkson-Leigh basketball game on December 5. Those who donated at the basketball game received a voucher for a free popcorn from the concession stand. In total, they collected 222 items to be donated locally or at the county level.

Trevor Hoffman - Entrepreneurship, Level 2

2nd Place, Gold Medal, State Qualifier

Trevor utilized his experience as the owner of the small business Connect Golf to complete the Entrepreneurship STAR project. In addition to including information about his current business, he considered plans for expansion and explored what the future of his business might look like. He also expanded his learning to include personnel management, marketing, and an understanding of health, fire, insurance, and zoning codes at both the local and state levels.

Averi Clausen, Avery Kuester, Wyatt Eisenmann - Sports Nutrition, Level 2

1st Place, Gold Medal, State Qualifier

"When we think about success in sports, we usually focus on training, talent, and motivation. But behind every strong performance, every personal best, and fast recovery, there is one essential factor working in the background: nutrition. Sports nutrition is not just about eating more food or following the latest diet trend. It is about fueling the body correctly so it can perform at its best and stay healthier over the long term."

After researching the nutritional recommendations for athletes, they provided meal and hydration plans to a fellow athlete here at school. They tracked his progress using MyFitnessPal to evaluate the results.

Lainey Urban - Career Investigation, Level 2

1st Place, Silver Medal, State Qualifier

For this project, Lainey chose to investigate a career as a Dietician. She conducted self-assessments and a vast amount of research on the field of dietetics, as well as participated in a job shadow with a dietician at Faith Regional Hospital in Norfolk.

Eisley Urban, Khloe Kabes, Emery Malena - Professional Presentation, Level 1
1st Place, Silver Medal, State Qualifier

Dancing Toward a Healthier Generation: 1 in 4 teens are not meeting the recommended one hour a day of physical activity. To help combat this issue, Eisley, Khloe, and Emery presented to the 7th and 8th grade students at Leigh, along with their dance group on the importance of physical activity, with a focus on the health benefits of dance. They focused on not only the benefits to an individual's physical health, but also their social and emotional wellbeing.

Ella Hansen, Kinna Closson - National Programs in Action, Level 1
2nd Place, Silver Medal, State Qualifier

Ella and Kinna chose to focus on the National Program, Student Body. Their goal was to educate the 3rd and 6th grade class about eating a well balanced diet that includes foods from all five food groups.

Layla Hollatz, Mariah Kasik, Harper Wendt - Focus on Children, Level 1
1st Place, Gold Medal, State Qualifier

The goal of this project was to educate the 4th grade students at Leigh Community Schools about physical and online safety. As part of their lesson, they created personal safety kits with the students. These kits included bandaids, gauze, hand sanitizer, kleenex, alcohol wipes and other basic first aid items. Each student was able to take their safety kit home or keep it in their backpack for minor emergencies.


