A Note from Mr. Fischer...

Much like the last few years, there is much discussion about education topics within the Nebraska Unicameral. I encourage stakeholders within the district to stay up to date on legislation that affects public schools and especially rural ones like LCS. Our State Senators are Bruce Bostelman and Mike Moser. I will always support bills that keep education a priority and politics out of our schools. We are a rapidly growing district that needs the state of Nebraska and Senators to understand that there is not a "one size fits all" for educational funding.

On March 21st and 22nd, LCS will have an "External Visit" that keeps LCS Accredited through Rule 10 of the State of Nebraska's Department of Education. We established goals 5 years ago and they will review our progress towards those goals. A small group of qualified individuals from other districts will visit and observe administrators, students, and teachers and report their findings. This information about our school improvement process can be found on the LCS website. I encourage all to take a look.

We have many activities that are being planned for the spring season. Information about field trips, open houses for Pre-K and Kindergarten, and other activities will be shared when details are finalized. This also means that state testing (NSCAS and ACT) will begin in a few weeks. When students do well on state tests, it can be a sign that they are receiving high-quality instruction, and that the school is effectively preparing students to meet academic standards. This can be beneficial for both students and LCS, as it can lead to higher student achievement and greater recognition for our school and our staff. Last year, our students scored very well on their tests and received an increased school rating that I have mentioned over the past couple of months. We expect our students to score well and continue to show improvement in all areas.

Congratulations to our winter activities and student groups on their success and hopefully they see continued success at their state competitions. Spring is right around the corner!

FCCLA Used Shoe Drive:

According to Earth.org, each year 92 million tons of clothing-related waste ends up in landfills. To put that into perspective, that is equal to a semi truck filled with clothes being put into a landfill every second. It could also fill one and a half Empire State buildings every day.



Fast fashion has almost doubled. This is the result of companies like Shien and Temu that produce clothing, which is not very high quality. This results in people having to throw away clothes earlier than normal and order more than usual. This is causing the fashion industry to produce more CO2 than aviation and shipping combined.

To help reduce the waste caused by fast fashion, Leigh FCCLA has participated in a project that helps reuse old shoes. To reach this goal, we asked members of our community to donate shoes which will be sent overseas to underprivileged countries, such as Cambodia, Ghana, and Haiti. These shoes will help families in these countries through microenterprise so that they can help make a living for their families.

Through this project, we have raised a total of 1,378 pairs of shoes. This is due to the support that we have received from students and community members who have donated. Thank you to everyone who has taken the time to look through their old shoes and donate the ones that they don't wear anymore.
