Last year, our students scored very well on their tests and received an EXCELLENT district rating that I have mentioned over the past couple of months. We expect our students to score well and continue to show improvement in all areas.

Congratulations to our winter activities and student groups on their success and hopefully they see continued success at their postseason competitions. Spring is right around the corner!


