District Testing

Senior Class Update

I am excited to share that our senior class has made excellent progress toward their post-secondary plans! Over the past few weeks, our seniors have:

Applied to College – Seniors have submitted applications to the colleges of their choice.

Created FAFSA FSA IDs – Students now have their FSA IDs, which is the first step in completing the FAFSA. As a reminder, completing the FAFSA is a **graduation requirement by the Nebraska Department of Education (NDE)** and opens on **October 1st**.

Started Scholarship Applications – Seniors have begun exploring and applying for scholarships to help fund their education.

On our **Apply to College Day**, staff showed their support and excitement for the seniors' next steps by proudly wearing their **college gear**, demonstrating to students the many opportunities ahead!

Highway 91 Career Fair 2025

On Wednesday, September 24th, Howells-Dodge High School hosted the fourth annual Highway 91 Career Day. This year's event welcomed 390 students in grades 9–12 from Howells-Dodge, Clarkson, Leigh, Humphrey, Lindsay Academy, Archangels, and St. Edward. The career fair was designed to connect students with valuable career exploration opportunities and equip them with skills for their future.

The day began with an engaging keynote presentation from Mike Donahue, founder of Value Up, a character-based education program that empowers students to embrace their value, build respect for others, and create a positive culture. Following the keynote, students participated in breakout sessions tailored to their grade level:

- Sophomores had a small-group breakout session with Mike Donahue, where they discussed tools for success and strategies for making positive choices.
- Juniors worked with Brandy Thompson from ESU 7, who presented essential job-keeping skills that will help them in the workplace.
- Seniors participated in mock interviews with community professionals, gaining firsthand experience in the interview process.

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While the high school students were engaged in the career fair, 152 junior high students from Howells-Dodge, Clarkson, Leigh, and Humphrey traveled to Wayne State College for a college visit. Their day included a campus tour, a visit to the planetarium, a session on planning for their future, and lunch in the campus dining hall.

This event was made possible through a grant written by the school counselors from Howells-Dodge, Clarkson, Leigh, and Humphrey, along with the generous support of local businesses and the participating school districts. Over the past four years, Highway 91 Career Day has continued to grow and thrive, and we look forward to providing this outstanding opportunity for our students each year.

What is Nebraska's Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)? / Qué es CHIP

CHIP is health care coverage for qualified children who are without other health insurance and who do not qualify for Medicaid. Federally called the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), it provides the same services covered under Medicaid.

CHIP provides well care for your child in helping prevent diseases, finding and treating problems early, and maintaining good health and development.
